Tips and Presentation Requirements

Presentation Requirements

*Each student will present to a panel of evaluators and an audience of family and friends, if he or she chooses to invite others.

*Each presentation should last approximately 10 minutes.

*The presentation must involve a speaking component with visual elements. It should incorporate technology use such as PowerPoint, Prezi, imovie, etc.

*Include quotes from the people you interact with during your project. Personal stories with your experiences enhance your presentation greatly.

*The following questions should be answered in detail within the presentation.

- Describe how you stepped it up your senior year. A **thorough** description of the project: Hours, tasks, communication, etc. This includes details about the before, during, and after aspects of your project. **This should include a timeline to help organize your details.**
- What steps did you take to make your project possible?
- What expectations did you have for your project? What was the outcome?
- What new skills did you acquire?
- What struggles or obstacles did you encounter with your project and how did you deal with these?
- In terms of your project, what are you most proud of?
- What kind of an impact did your project have on others?
- What would you recommend to others based on your experiences?
- How do you think your project will help you in the future?

Tips for a great presentation

*Show your project in action - Provide clear evidence that you completed your project.

*Your slides should show the process of completion.

*Include photos, a lot of photos! This shows clear evidence.

*Look over the rubric when you are creating your presentation.

*Good eye contact.

*Be courteous, gracious, and professional.

*Dress nicely and appropriately.

*Don't read your presentation! Tell a story. Some of the best presentations are told with stories.

*Be early to your appointed time. (You will receive your specific time in April.)

*Practice your presentation.
