#### **Did You Know?**

Deerfield High School was built in 1889, two years before the Village of Deerfield became incorporated. There were eighteen (18) students in the high school at that time.

The first graduating class of three students was celebrated in 1894. Those students were Lewis Brictson, Scott De Lay and John Rodby. The graduation ceremonies were held at the Deerfield Opera House in the early years.

In January 1967, the current high school building opened after a two day moving effort by the students and staff. The current high school houses grades 7-12 in the same location at the top of Simonson Boulevard.

The new elementary school located on Quarry Street opened in the fall of 2004 and houses early childhood to sixth grade.

### Through the Years

The Deerfield Community School District was comprised of many one-room school houses. Slowly, the district began consolidating the rural schools into the schools located in the village.
