## **HEARING AND VISION SCREENING**

Routine hearing and vision screening as indicated below will be done on a yearly basis. If you suspect a problem with your child at any time during the year, even though he/ she has already been screened, please let me know and a screening can be arranged. You will be notified by letter if your child does not pass the screenings.

4K – Vision 3rd - Vision K- Vision/Hearing 5th - Vision

1st - Vision/Hearing

Please keep in mind this is only a screening and by no means should this take the place of a formal evaluation by a professional doctor. Just a few facts regarding vision: > 80% of all learning is achieved through vision.

>School screenings only identify children with Amblyopia(lazy eye) and difficulty seeing the blackboard, school screenings miss some significant eye problems.

> Children with vision problems often become behavior problems in classrooms.

The following is a list of possible signs of vision or hearing trouble:

## Vision:

Rubs eyes excessively

Tilts head or thrusts head forward

Poor concentration

Sitting too close to the TV

Has difficulty with reading or other close-up work

Blinks more than usual or is irritable when doing close-up work

Reads or does homework reluctantly or hurriedly

May exhibit disruptive classroom behavior

Poor visual tracking (following an object)

Red rimmed, encrusted or swollen eyelids

Inflamed or water eyes

Recurring sties(infections) on eyelids

Eyes itch, burn, or feel scratchy

Dizziness, headaches or nausea following close-up work

Blurred or double vision

Shuts or covers one eye

Short attention span

Squints or frowns

## Hearing:

Limited, poor, or no speech

Seems frequently inattentive

Voice has increased volume

Has difficulty learning

Childhood hearing loss in family members

Frequent ear infections
